

**THE USE OF THE MUSEUM OF HUMAN DISEASE'S DIGITISED COLLECTION:
TEACHING, PUBLIC HEALTH AND ENGAGEMENT**

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Since 1995 the Museum of Human Disease at the University of new South Wales has gone through several versions of a digital collection. Firstly, a purpose built CD-ROM interactive, that was migrated to a web-based catalogue, then an app and finally as part of a dedicated biomedical education image repository. Now we are starting a process to create 3D photogrammetry objects of our specimen for use in interactive teaching. This collection summarises recent research on the usefulness of the digitised collection in medical education and public health. We then detail the progress and assessment of our 3D project and the usefulness of this in teaching and public health.
